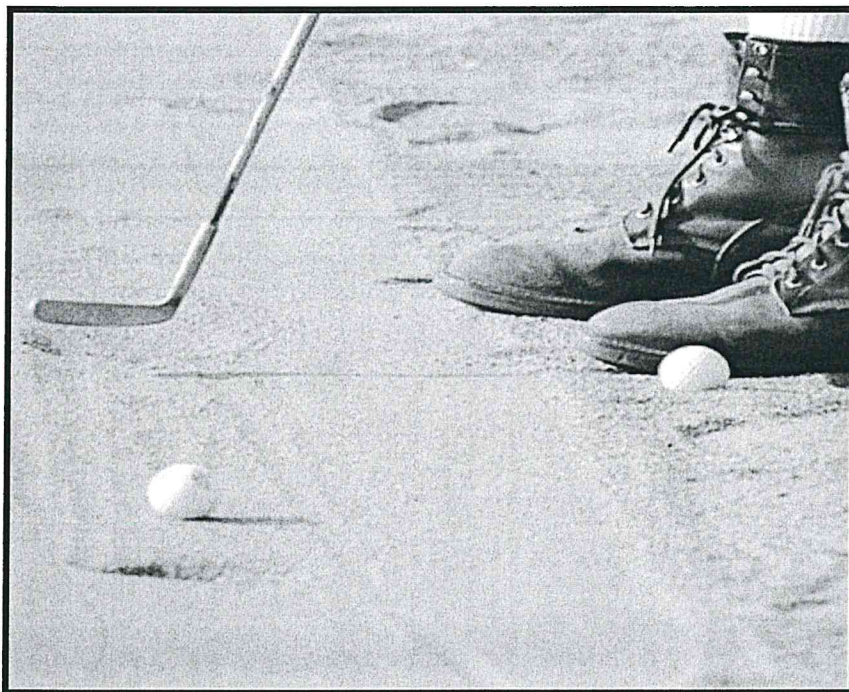




- ☞ Springville Country Club originally had nine sand and oil greens. Our greens were 40 foot diameter circle and moistened by oil. The golfer didn't putt from where your ball ended up on the green, but from the equivalent distance along a corridor smoothed by a heavy drag or mop. After completing a hole the sand is raked for the next group. Surfaces weren't very fast, but they would putt better than you imagined.

- ☞ August 24, 1922: Groups of members were assigned to greens and their duties for the rest of the season were to remove grass and weeds and continue to care for it. At year end, the members who cared the best for their hole were awarded a dozen golf balls.
- ☞ October 12, 1922: Members were required to sign the club by-laws which were posted at the Springville Post Office.
- ☞ November 23, 1922: Membership classes and fees: Full Member \$50, Associate Member \$15, Junior Member \$5, Clergy \$0.
- ☞ January 25, 1923: Board of Directors proposed planting trees on 43 acres to the East of the Railroad tracks which was once deemed excellent pasture land.



- March 1, 1923: Season passes were sold for \$13 per couple to attend the 15 dances that would be held in the 1923 season.
- March 1, 1923: Golfing members were asked to donate \$10 a season for the upkeep of the golf course.
- April 12, 1923: Will Fisher was hired as groundskeeper.
- May 30, 1923: All 9 sand greens were to be leveled, smoothed and resanded. New sod was to be installed on all tee boxes with sand and water kept at each. The club also borrowed a 3500 pound roller to smooth out all the fairways.

- July 1923: Caddie house (Pro Shop) was built and golfers were asked to sign in to register before playing hole #1, and record their score upon completion of their round.
- August 2, 1923: Citizen National Bank in Springville issued scorecards
