



- December 1, 1923: 1st Annual Season end banquet was held and Steel Shaft Brassies were awarded to two members for their leadership during the past golf season.
- December 1, 1923: Names of the past years tournaments: Flag Tournament on Decoration Day, Williams Connors Cup, Glenn Pop Warner Cup, R.B> Waite Cup and Father/ Son Tourney
- June 4, 1925: Paid park attendance 1200 people
- August 20, 1925 : caretaker of SCC B.E. Shippy drilled for water on the course and found water a a depth of 28 feet and supply was 7 feet deep in very coarse gravel.
- May 27, 1926: 14 dances were scheduled for the 1926 season.
- May 30, 1926: Paid park attendance 2000 people.
- May 30, 1926: Food Menu read: hot roast pork sandwich, nice juicy hamburger, delicious hot dogs, homemade pies, Pura Golf Ice cream, ice cold pop and orangeade, excellent coffee and satisfaction guaranteed. * Bylaws prohibited alcohol on the grounds.
- August 8, 1929: Dr. Ralph B. Waite said that he would furnish the money required to build the remaining 6 sand greens converting them to bent grass ones.

The committee has been hard at work to prepare a memorable season that will incorporate fun events and provide the membership insight into the rich history that makes up this wonderful club.

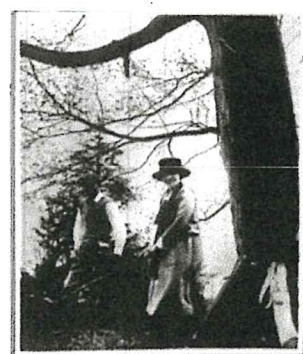

March 27th 1930: The annual kite flying contest was held with 25 prizes awarded to entice community interest in doing something for the girls and boys.

April 30th 1930: Annual Golf Banquet of SCC was held at the Presbyterian church with forty guests attending.

November 10th 1932: Annual Election of Board of Directors was held and a profit of \$79.09 was reported for the year.

November 9th 1933: At annual meeting 5 directors were elected to serve for the next three years. An amendment to the bylaws was passed to extend number of directors from 15 to 20.

March 1st 1934: Members William Bensley and John Pugh played one or more rounds at SCC every month for 34 continuous months starting in April 1934.

October 16, 1941: Members of SCC held "Bill Barker Day" at which time they did honor the club pro.

September 17th 1942: Member Alan Brown won his 36 hole match and was crowned new club champion.

June 5th 1943: Several members of SCC hired a hay rack and journeyed to the club under the power of a horse named "Rosie".

February 20, 1947: Dr. Ralph B. Waite was honored as outstanding alumni's of the year by Temple University.
