


October 14, 1965: Bob Brock of Boston established new course record of 2 under par 69.


July 7 1966: Bill Lowe shot 6 under par 65 to set new course record.

September 7, 1967: Bill Jax was awarded the "Black Blazer of Victory" as winner of the annual round robin tournament.

June 6, 1968: Kenneth Hildebrand passed suddenly in the home on SCC grounds. He served as greenkeeper at SCC from July 1957 until his passing at the age of 42.

June 20, 1968: The Springville Country Club made a monumental decision on this date that will go down in SCC history as one of the greatest decisions, they hired a young 22 year old assistant groundskeeper at Brookfield Country Club to be the head groundskeeper. He started at the age of 15, mowing greens and raking traps at Brookfield. At age of 19 he was elevated to the position of assistant groundskeeper. The beautifulness of SCC can be rooted in Roger's dedication to SCC in his 44 years of service.
